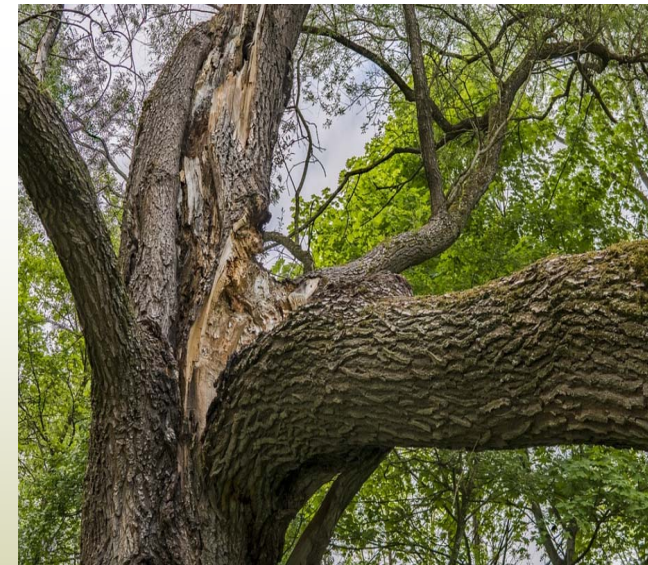

About

This workshop will teach safe techniques for working with trees under extreme compression/tension or damage due to weather or other situations. Understanding the hazards that trees with attached root balls, tangled and/or split stems or other dangerous situations can present. Dismantling of these dangerous situations with various cutting techniques, and using ropes and winches to manage some situation safely will be included in this training.

Prerequisite:

Students must have completed Game Of Logging 1 & 2 prior to attending this Storm Damage Cleanup workshop.
